

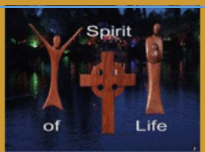
Some of NAT's Current Programs.....

**Northern Access Television** is a local, Northern Suburbs based television production group. Our aim is to give access to TV production and broadcasting facilities to all people regardless of ability, gender or culture.

We are part of the **Melbourne Community Television Consortium**, better known as Channel 31, Melbourne.

Our first test transmission was in November 1990. Today our members are involved in many aspects of TV production for Channel 31.

Northern Access TV, being a full member of the Consortium, has guaranteed access to air-time on **Channel 31**.

**PRODUCERS** of programs for us must be members of NAT. Producers are responsible for their programs, including the financing and the technical quality as well as content. NAT reserves the right to select which programs will be submitted under its banner. No program can be submitted to Channel 31 on behalf of NAT without the correct paperwork and authority from Northern Access TV.



**THE NAT COMMITTEE** is elected each year at our AGM which is usually held around August. The committee consists of members including the **CHAIRPERSON**, **DEPUTY CHAIR**, **SECRETARY**, and **TREASURER**. The committee also puts forward nominees for a **Consortium Management Committee Representative** who, if elected, sits on the Management Committee of the Consortium which oversees the day to day operation of the consortium as a whole. Also appointed by the committee are **delegates to the ASSEMBLY**. The Assembly is the peak policy making body of the Consortium.

Other responsibilities are assigned by the committee as necessary. All positions are voluntary.

**C31 Melbourne and Victoria is a not-for-profit television service providing locally based entertainment, education and information. C31 provides access and representation to the many diverse communities within Victoria.**

**Transmitted from Mount Dandenong, C31's signal reaches homes throughout Melbourne and Geelong on Digital Television Channel 44.**

Broadcasting in over 20 different languages, you can find faces, voices and issues which are not present in mainstream television, including Somali TV, Deaf TV, Bent TV and SYN TV (students and youth)

C31 has been servicing Melbourne's Communities since October 1994, via a Temporary broadcasting licence. The Australian Broadcasting Authority recognised C31's role as an essential contributor to Melbourne's media scene, awarding the Station the full-time community broadcasting licence on 30 July, 2004

C31 broadcast twenty-four hours of programming every day, with over 1.3 million Melburnians tuning in each month. For further information on community television in Melbourne and Australia, you can visit the stations web site.
